





- Summary Report

Total money raised £4708

Number of beneficiaries

2700 benefited from cooked meals

100 families received 30 litre bottle of fresh water

150 mosquito nets given out to families


An additional £1800 was raised to provide dry food items to families for a month a total 336 men, women, and children.

Floods and Landslides Result in at Least 1,265 Deaths, Damage or Destroy 1.4 Million Houses Across Pakistan.

Heavy monsoon rains and glacial lake outbursts since mid-June have resulted in flooding and landslides across Pakistan, resulting in significant damage and humanitarian needs in at least 80 of Pakistan's 160 districts in Sindh, Balochistan, Punjab, and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) provinces and Gilgit Baltistan Region, according to the Government of Pakistan (GoP).

Pakistan has experienced nearly threefold its 30-year average annual rainfall countrywide in 2022, with rainfall in Sindh and Balochistan approximately five times higher than average.

As of September 2, the floods had adversely affected an estimated 33 million people, resulted in the deaths of at least 1,265 individuals, injured more than 12,500 additional people, and damaged or destroyed approximately 1.4 million houses countrywide, the GoP National Disaster Management Agency (NDMA) reports. As a result of your donations and assistance, Sadaqah Project has been providing flood relief to people in the south of Punjab and Sind in Pakistan over the past two months.

Distribution of dry food

The project provided food packs to the most vulnerable families in Union Council Kotla Easan, District Rajanpur South Punjab.

A total of £1800 was raised to support this project, which targets 336 men, women, and children.







Distribution of cooked food

For the cooked food project in Khipro Sanghar Sind Karachi, £1950 was raised and funded this project.

Over the course of three weeks, 2700 members of the public were fed.







Distribution of Mosquito Nets

- To prevent mosquito-borne diseases such as malaria and dengue fever, 150 mosquito nets worth £600 were distributed to locals in Sind.








Distribution of clean water

The project provided clean water to the most vulnerable families in the desert areas of Sind.







Sadaqah Project continue to provide ongoing support to victims of floods in Pakistan.

We are now working with our partners in Pakistan to find out how we start to support those affected by the floods to begin to put their lives together by targeting their long term needs so that they can support themselves financially to support their families.
